Gilfach is an upland hill farm with sixty acres of diverse pasture, woodland and undergrowth. It is lightly farmed and is currently home to five horses, six ouessant sheep, chickens, ducks and our Brecon Buff goose.

Gilfach is also home to myself (Hugh), my daughter and 5 year old grandson. We have a Chocolate Labrador, Oscar, and a Cocker Spaniel, Poppy. The dogs are very friendly and enjoy the company of guests of all ages. Not to be forgotten is Fluffy the cat.

In recent years the farm has diversified to provide five beautiful individual self-catering accommodations including the Barn Cottage, Barn Loft, Log Cabin, Shepherds Hut and during the summer months the Bell Tent.

Safety First!

We really hope you have a wonderful stay with us and we encourage you to explore our beautiful piece of Welsh countryside. We have woods, views, streams and an abundance of flora and fauna.

However it is paramount that all our guests and visitors remain safe. We therefore ask you to;

- ★ Be aware that we are a working family farm. Please do not enter the barns/stables
- ★ Please keep your dog(s) on a lead at all times whilst on the yard and never leave your dog(s) outside unattended. Horses will kick a dog if it gets too close
- ★ Note that the yard can become unexpectedly busy at times with livestock, vehicles and visiting neighbours on horseback
- ★ Please do not allow young children to roam without supervision. In particular do not allow children to walk into the fields to stroke the horses or play on/around the machinery in the yard and barns. This can be extremely dangerous
- ★ Do give all our horses a wide berth. If they do come up to you whilst walking be extremely mindful that they can bite at one end and kick at the other! Generally our livestock are placid but there's no way of knowing when they're having a bad day. Always give them space and NEVER feed them
- ★ And lastly, please be aware that the swings and slide (and other play equipment) in the vegetable garden are private for family use only

With these points in mind we hope you have a safe and pleasant stay!

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Bedding

We hope that you have the best night's sleep whilst staying with us so we've put a lot of thought into your bedding;

- All your beds have [Baavet Natural Wool Duvets](#) made in Britain using 100% British wool!



Baavet wool duvets are made using the finest natural materials, 100% British wool fillings and 100% pure cotton casings. The natural antibacterial properties of wool, along with its inherent ability to regulate both temperature and moisture, create the best possible conditions for a healthy natural night's sleep. No chemicals, no fire retardants, no man-made fibres.

- There are luxury mattress toppers from John Lewis on top of your luxury pocket sprung mattresses for an extra bit of squish!
- We provide two different pillow types on your beds;
 - 100% feather fill (which are suitable for house dust mite allergy sufferers)
 - 100% polyester fill
- All duvet covers and pillowcases are 100% cotton and are freshly washed in non-biological detergent

Sleep well!

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Heating

In 2007 Hugh installed a biomass boiler in the main barn. The boiler is run on solid wood fuel which we harvest ourselves from our larch woodland on the hill. It is as local and home grown as you can get! This boiler supplies the entirety of the heating on the farm, as a result;

- We have set the boiler to provide heating between 7am and 11pm every day
- All of the radiators in the cottage have individual thermostats that can be adjusted to suit your needs. We suggest that the upstairs radiators are put on number “1” and the downstairs radiators number “4”
- If you would like additional heat please feel free to use the log burner in the lounge (see Log Burner info sheet for instructions on how to use)

If you are still not warm enough, would like the time clock adjusting or need more wood - please ask!



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Water

We are very lucky at Gilfach Farm to have our own water supply coming from a natural spring on the hill!

As much as we love our water, for our guests peace of mind;

- All of the water that comes into the barn cottage is treated with a sediment pre filter and an ultra violet filter to ensure that there is no bacteria - hot and cold
- In the event of a power cut we recommend that you boil your water until the electric is back on
- The water is tested by the Environmental Health department from the local county council on a yearly basis to ensure its safety

Please note that none of the outside taps are treated.



We usually have a plentiful supply of water (all that Welsh rain!) however in the summer during a heat wave the supply can run low. We ask that you are always considerate of your water use but especially during these times;

- **Turn off the tap when you brush your teeth** – this can save 6 litres of water per minute
- **Take a shorter shower.** Showers can use anything between 6 and 45 litres per minute
- **Fill a jug with tap water and place this in your fridge.** This will mean you do not have to leave the cold tap running for the water to run cold before you fill your glass

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Recycling

We make a huge effort on the farm to recycle as much as we can. In fact we have a whole room dedicated to it. We can recycle almost anything as long as it's not contaminated (even film from packaging). In order to help us;

- Please rinse/wash/clean all of your recycling - this is vital. If the recycling is not clean the council will not collect it (and it will smell and attract vermin)
- All your recyclable materials can be collected in the same bin (the grey one next to the front door)
- All food waste (even cooked food and bones) can go into the green caddy provided
- If you have filled your bins you can empty them into the relevant bins in the recycling room - it is behind the black stable door facing the farm entrance gate
- If you do not want to separate your recycling (there is an information board to help you with this) just tip your CLEAN recycling into the designated bin (blue/green crate next to the stable door) and we'll sort it out for you! Yup, we really are that committed!



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Free WiFi

All of the holiday accommodations on the farm have access to our superfast broadband (30Mb/s), it should be ample for all your needs including streaming video. To access the cottage wifi select;

This superfast broadband connection has been made possible through the provider Dyfed IT and a community scheme in our valley where each farm has a wifi link that bounces the broadband to the next farm up the valley.

Log Burner

All log burners have their own little quirks, so to get the best out of this one we have put together some instructions for you;

To light:

- Leave the ash in the grate
- Make a hole through the ash in the center of the grate
- Ensure that any ash that might be in the ash pan is not blocking the hole
- Place a lighted fire lighter (provided in the bowl) over the hole in the ash
- Place three or four logs (provided in the basket) aligned front to back over the firelighter
- Open the bottom spin wheel vent completely
- Open the top vent using the slider
- Close the door - **the log burner must always be operated with the door closed**, please do not leave open



When the fire is burning well:

- Close the bottom spin wheel vent completely - otherwise all the heat just goes up the chimney!
- Use the top vent to control the fire

If the ash is cleared from the grate, too much air is directed around the logs and lighting is more difficult.

When logs burn well, there is practically no ash left behind. Ash rarely needs to be removed from the log burner.

The top vent directs airflow down the inside face of the glass and prevents it from sooting up. The airflow is then directed into the base of the fire.

The fire lighters provided are eco lighters made from timber shavings, natural resin and wax. We find them to be an effective eco alternative to the classic white paraffin tablets.

Fire Precautions

We have installed a central fire alarm system which covers the cottage, barn loft, log cabin, boiler room and tack room. Please take note of the following for your safety;

- Please do not smoke in any of the buildings
- Note where fire extinguishers and fire blankets are located
- There is a smoke detector on the landing, this is linked to the central fire alarm system
- In case of a fire a loud siren will sound inside the cottage and in the yard outside the farm house
- It is NOT connected to the emergency services. Dial 999 if assistance is required
 - What3Words - ///gardens.surveyors.orbited
 - Grid Reference - SN898302
- A false alarm can be silenced on the control panel in the boiler room - go through the large black double doors to the right of the cottage, the panel is just inside to the right
- The Nest carbon monoxide and smoke detector in the lounge is NOT connected to the central fire alarm - if the log burner activates this detector by accident please open/doors windows till the smoke clears

Oscar (the chocolate labrador) and Poppy (the black cocker spaniel) are both very friendly and Oscar in particular really loves our guests. For their own health and happiness;

- **Please don't feed them** (especially Oscar, he's really perfected those feed me eyes!) – we have to watch their weight carefully – all those just a bit here and just a bit there really add up
- **Please don't keep them in overnight** - they have a dog flap in the farmhouse door so they can always get back in and we miss them
- They love to go on walks around the farm (again especially Oscar) and they will like to accompany you – but please don't take them onto the road
- If you find their attention unwelcome – please let us know and we will ensure they do not bother you

Guest Dogs

Dogs (and other animals!) are all very welcome in any of our accommodations at Gilfach and we hope they enjoy our farm as much as you do.

Facilities available for your four legged companions;

- We have a wash stand outside the horse barn where you can wash down your dog(s) after a muddy walk
- Dog towels are available in the main barn next to the boot racks
- You and your dog(s) are welcome to explore the whole of the farm (just be mindful of the livestock - see Walking around the farm)
- There is a stream at the bottom of the farm that dogs particularly like playing in!

Very im-paw-tant;

- Please ask your dog not to sleep on beds for people or sofas!
- **Do not let your dog roam the yard unattended.** For your own safety and for the welfare of the animals (and other guests) please keep your dog on a lead
- Everyone knows how unpleasant dog mess is and it can cause infections, so **please clean up after your dog** - bagged mess can be deposited in the large green wheelie bin in the recycling room (right of the door)



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Walking around the farm - guest dogs

We encourage you and your four legged friends to explore our farm but to ensure your dog does not disturb wildlife, farm animals, horses or other people it is important to keep your dog supervised, please;

- Keep your dog on a lead, or
- Keep it in sight at all times, be aware of what it's doing and be confident it will return to you promptly on command
- However, if cattle or horses chase you and your dog, it is safer to let your dog off the lead – don't risk getting hurt by trying to protect it. Your dog will be much safer if you let it run away from a farm animal in these circumstances and so will you

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The BBQ Hut

In the main garden we have a beautiful BBQ Hut of which guests are welcome to use. With great views of the garden and down the valley, it is a lovely spot to cook up a barbie, or anything else for that matter. Available every day, any time of the year, whatever the weather - even in winter it soon warms up inside and we have installed lighting too for when the nights start drawing in.

- 🔥 **Free to use!** If you would like to use the BBQ hut please tell us so we can reserve it for you. Please understand that we only allow one guest booking per day so that we have time to clean between use
- 🔥 Inside the BBQ Hut we have supplied you with BBQ utensils and some plates, cups and cutlery
- 🔥 We suggest guests bring their own charcoal for the BBQ however a bucket of charcoal can be purchased on the farm if needed (£5)
- 🔥 When lighting the BBQ we recommend you fill the BBQ no more than half full so you don't become too hot
- 🔥 The hut has electric lighting inside - the black dimmer switch is up on the shelf on the right hand side of the doors as you go in
- 🔥 Enjoy!



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Walking on the farm

We hope that you get to explore the farm. You are welcome to follow two footpaths that we have waymarked.

The orange waymarkers show the way for the “Farm Walk” which takes you up the farm through the forestry to the top of our hill where there are some terrific views.

The blue waymarkers show the way for the “Circular Walk” which takes you in a loop along the farm track, down over the stream and up again to meet the lane which then leads you back to our yard.

Before you set off please be aware;

- The farm tracks can be very muddy and slippery in wet weather, we suggest sturdy footwear
- Please ensure that your dog(s) stay away from livestock at all times
- Do not walk up to the horses - they can kick at one end and bite at the other
- Please leave all gates as you find them - open or shut

Our dog Oscar (the Chocolate Labrador) often likes to walk with our guests, he is welcome to accompany you but please do not leave the farm with him without asking first.

If Poppy (the black Cocker Spaniel) wants to walk too that is ok, but she usually turns back after a short distance to go back home. Please don't prevent her if she wants to go back, she will find her way.

Please note - there are no public footpaths on the hill opposite the farm.

Farm Walk directions

(Follow the Orange Waymarkers)

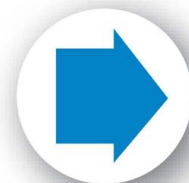
- Starting in the yard take the main farm track at the top of the yard and go left - behind the farmhouse and below the polytunnel
- Following the track up the hill, go through the metal gate (which crosses the track by the field shelter) and immediately turn right
- Follow the track up to, and walk through, the forestry. At the end of the forestry turn left and walk directly up to reach the fence line at the top of the hill. Enjoy the view!
- You can then follow the fence line (to the left) along the top of the hill and back down, where at the bottom you will join back onto the track
- Turn left onto the track and follow the track down, going through the gate again and back to the yard



Circular Walk directions

(Follow the Blue Waymarkers)

- Starting in the yard take the main track at the top of the yard and go right - behind the log cabin
- Follow the track along and down (turning right before you go through the gate way) to the stream
- At the bottom of the track there is a footbridge. Please note that this is the boundary of our farm and that you will be continuing on a public right of way.
- Cross the footbridge and continue to follow the track which will open on to our neighbours yard. We please ask that you are considerate of our neighbours and proceed through their yard to the right quietly and ensure that your dogs are well behaved
- You will come to the lane on your right. Follow the lane (back towards the farm) until you reach the entrance of our farm on your right where you can walk up our track back to the yard



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Laundry Room

We have a laundry room inside the main barn which you are welcome to use.

When facing the cottage go through the large black double doors to the right of the cottage. The laundry room is through the door on the left.

- If you find the machines full, please empty them into a washing basket (there will be plenty in the room) and put it up on a work surface (do not leave on the floor). This will help us keep track of what's clean and what's still to be done!
- To keep energy use down we try to dry as much of our laundry as possible on the line. If the weather is good we have a collapsible line which we put up directly outside the barn doors. Otherwise we use the 4 lines that we've installed in the main barn next to the biomass boiler. Please feel free to use these.

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Muddy Boots/Gear/Bikes and Spare Wellies

Have you been on a really good walk or bike ride and got a bit wet and muddy? Lets face it, it does rain a lot in Wales! We appreciate you may not want to bring these into your lovely accommodations so we have provided some facilities for all your mucky stuff;

Wash off

To get the worst of the muck off your waterproofs/boots/bikes please feel free to use the wash stand in the yard outside the horse stables. We also have a pressure washer available on request.

In the summer when water is low please use the water from the galvanised trough beside the stand instead. **Do not place dirty items in the trough.**

Hang out to dry

In the boiler room there is a rail and hangers for you to hang up all your wet gear and racks for your wellies/walking boots.

Park up your bikes

There are also bike stands in the boiler room for you to lock up your bike during your stay and to keep them out of the rain.

Forgot your wellies?

Coming soon - If you've forgotten your wellies we have a range of sizes available for you to borrow. Please return them to the boiler room after use.

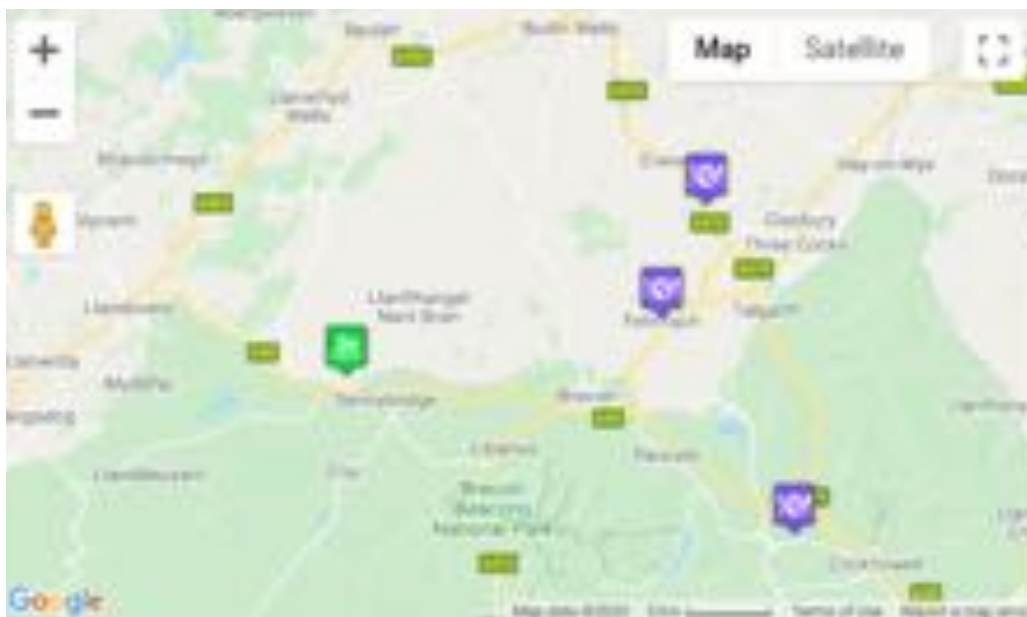

Gilfach Farm to Trallong Common circuit (21km)

Start from the farm

This is an excellent route for taking the eBikes! It can also be walked but be aware that except for the common the rest of the route is on roads.

Epynt Way - Circular route 5 (Pentrebach)

Usk Reservoir (5 miles / 8 km)

15 min drive to "Usk Reservoir car parking"

An excellent circular cycling and walking trail around the beautiful Usk Reservoir. It follows good compacted-stone forestry tracks and tarmac roads alongside the waters edge and through the surrounding woodland of the Glasfynydd Forest. There are also splendid views of the surrounding countryside and mountains.

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Fan Hir (7 miles)

19 min drive to "Tarafen-y-Garreg car park"

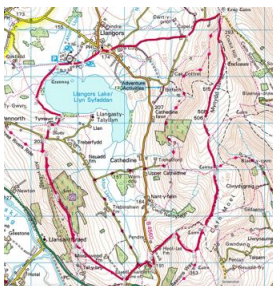


Llyn Cwm Llwlch (3 miles / 5 km)

Llyn Cwm Llwlch is the best preserved glacial lake in South Wales. The walk starts at the car park near the lake and involves a steep climb along the Cwm Llwlch river to the beautiful lake. (This walk can also be continued to reach Pen y Fan.)

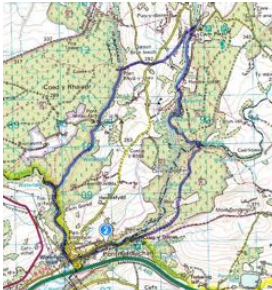
Llyn y Fan Fach a Fawr (9 miles / 14.5 km)

31 min drive to "Llyn y Fan car park"

This challenging circular walk visits Llyn Y Fan Fawr and Llyn Y Fan Fach. These two beautiful, isolated lakes are located close to each other on the northern margin of the Black Mountain in Carmarthenshire. It's a very peaceful and remote area with stunning scenery for the duration of the route. The walk runs for a distance of about 9 miles with some challenging climbs to the mountains which rise up above the lakes.

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The Waterfalls (11 miles)

37 min drive to "Four Waterfalls Car Park"

Another from Andy Jones's blog - This is an excellent walk for when poor weather prevents you going up high. The walk starts from the car park at Ystradfellte, where the river Mellte vanishes underground leaving a series of caves behind. The sandstone that dominates most of the national park, here gives way to limestone that allows the formation of these caves and the Mellte, Hepste, Pyrddin and Neath rivers to create the greatest concentration of waterfalls in Wales.

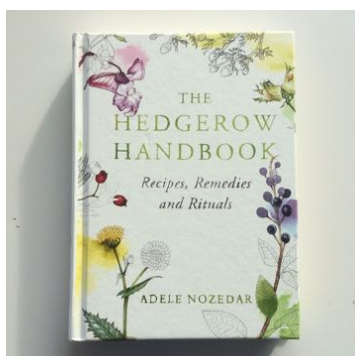

Red Kite Feeding Station - Llanddeusant

A truly Welsh icon is the Red Kite. We have red kites flying over our farm every day however they're always high up. If you would like to see these once endangered birds up close then there is no better way than going to our local red kite feeding station at Llanddeusant (just 20 min drive away) where you will get to see them (100s of them!) up close as they dive for food. You'll be amazed by just how big these beautiful birds really are!

A few Q and As;

Q: Do I need to book?

A: No not usually, unless it is a very big party and you are unsure in which case contact us beforehand. We welcome school groups etc.

Q: When are you open?

A: Every day. Yes every day! 365 Days of the year.

Q: When do you feed the kites?

A: 2pm GMT and 3pm BST - **please arrive before the feed time so you can get to the hides.**

Q: Do you feed the Red Kites in bad weather?

A: Yes. The hides will keep you dry in the wet. No heating though!

Q: Do you have access for disabled persons?

A: Yes. Ramps and wide access points in place.

Q: Can I photograph the Red Kites?

A: Yes, don't miss a glorious opportunity to capture the event.

Q: Are dogs allowed?

A: Yes - But please have them on a lead at all times (even well behaved dogs). **Do not leave dogs in cars or tied up.**

Eco Friendly

We are working hard to make our holiday accommodations (and farm) as eco friendly as possible and we are already well on our way;

Electricity

Our farm is supplied by [Octopus Energy](#) – who supplies us (and all its other customers) with 100% green electricity.

Water

We are very lucky to have our own water supply coming from a natural spring on the hill. This spring supplies our entire farm so we do encourage responsible water use, especially during the summer months.

Gas

There is no gas supply to the farm.

Heating

In 2007 Hugh installed a biomass boiler in the main barn. The boiler is run on solid wood fuel which we harvest ourselves from our own larch woodland on the hill. It is as local and home grown as you can get!

In the Barn Cottage and Shepherds Hut, for extra cosy comfort, we have small wood burners. The logs supplied come from our own woodlands and the fire lighters provided are eco lighters made from timber shavings, natural resin and wax. We find them to be an effective eco alternative to the classic white paraffin tablets.

Lighting

Wherever possible we use LED lighting/bulbs.

We are also in an [IDA International Dark Sky Reserve](#)! As such we are committed to ensuring light pollution is reduced where possible. We encourage guests to use torches and to not leave any lights on when they are not in use (the most important one being the outdoor light).

Recycling

Wales has the [highest recycling rate in the UK](#) (at 62.8%) and we make a huge effort on the farm to recycle as much as we absolutely can. We can recycle almost anything as long as it's not contaminated – if it's not collected by our local county council (such as plastic film) then we collect it ourselves and take it to our local recycling centre – yup, we're that committed!

Cleaning products

All the products we use have the following criteria;

- quick and complete biodegradability
- minimum impact on aquatic life
- against animal testing
- suitable for septic tanks
- plant based & mineral ingredients - vegan

We are proud of the products we use which include [Ecover](#), [BioD](#), [Method](#) and [Faith in Nature](#). Ecover comes from a [true platinum zero waste factory](#) (they divert 98.1% of their factory waste from landfill through reduction projects, reuse, reducing and recycling and have identified a clean route to achieving zero% within the next couple of years). Method is an arm of Ecover. Both Faith in Nature and BioD are based and made in the UK.

Reducing plastic waste

We sat down and worked out how many single use plastic bottles we used to get through in a year and it was a scary number (in the 100s)! Washing up liquid, hand wash, shower gel and cleaning products – it all added up. Of course we recycled them but we knew it would be better to reduce rather than recycle. As a result we now purchase all of our products in bulk so that we can wash and refill just a few bottles with no need to purchase and bin any more. It's not perfect, but it's progress!

Sponges

Furthering our commitment to reducing plastic use we also researched alternatives to the plastic sponges and foam dishcloths we used to provide in the self-catering kitchens. These items could not be reused or recycled and had to be thrown away after each guest. Considering we welcome 1 night stays and up, the number of sponges and cloths we got through was vast.

We now use “[UnSponges](#)” made by Rowen Stillwater. These are plastic free and reusable (we put them in the wash after every guest). Also, when the sponge reaches the end of its useful life it can be cut up and composted! In place of the foam dishcloths we are now providing 100% cotton dishcloths which we also wash and reuse.

Toilet paper

We are proud users of [Who Gives a Crap](#). An awesome company who not only makes 100% recycled toilet paper and forest friendly bamboo tissues with zero plastic packaging but they also donate 50% of their profits to help build toilets and improve sanitation in the developing world.

Tree planting

Over 2018, 2019 and 2020 we’ve planted 7,000 native trees on the farm! Why? Because we love our farm and wanted to give something back – combating climate change, improving water management and maintaining and enhancing biodiversity. This Herculean effort was made possible through the Glastir Woodland Creation Scheme administered by the Welsh Government.
